The Theory of Everything [Friday 1/9 – Monday 1/12 and Thursday 1/15. Wednesday 1/14, \$5 MATINEE, 1:00 pm] 2 hours, 3 minutes | PG-13 | Biography, Drama, Romance. Starring Eddie Redmayne (“Les Misérables”) and Felicity Jones (“The Amazing Spider-Man 2”), this is the extraordinary story of one of the world’s greatest living minds, the renowned astrophysicist Stephen Hawking, who falls deeply in love with fellow Cambridge student Jane Wilde.

Dance Film Sundays: Bolshoi Ballet in the Legend of Love [Sunday 1/11, \$10/\$6 children, 3:00 pm, 2 hours, 20 minutes] The Bolshoi Ballet in The Legend of Love, an HD cinema experience captured live in October, 2014 at Moscow’s Bolshoi Theater. A major revival by The Bolshoi, The Legend of Love—a modern master work—catapulted choreographer Yuri Grigorovich into the limelight when it premiered in 1965.

Citizenfour [Friday 1/16 – Monday 1/19 & Thursday 1/22, 7:15 pm. Wednesday 1/21, \$5 MATINEE, 1:00 pm] 1 hour 54 min | Documentary. Citizenfour is a real life thriller, unfolding by the minute, giving audiences unprecedented access to filmmaker Laura Poitras and journalist Glenn Greenwald’s encounters with Edward Snowden in Hong Kong, as he hands over classified documents providing evidence of mass indiscriminate and illegal invasions of privacy by the National Security Agency (NSA).

The Babadook [Friday 1/16 & Saturday 1/17, LATE SHOW 9:15 pm] 1 hour, 33 minutes | NR | Drama, Horror, Thriller. Six years after the violent death of her husband, Amelia (Essie Davis) is at a loss. She struggles to discipline her 'out of control' 6 year-old, Samuel (Noah Wiseman), a son she finds impossible to love. Samuel’s dreams are plagued by a monster he believes is coming to kill them both.

Big Eyes [Friday 1/23 – Monday 1/26 & Thursday 1/29, 7:15 pm. Wednesday 1/28, \$5 MATINEE, 1:00 pm] 1 hour 46 min | Biography | Drama | Rated PG. Directed and produced by Tim Burton, BIG EYES is based on the true story of Walter Keane (Christoph Waltz), who was one of the most successful painters of the 1950s and early 1960s. The artist earned staggering notoriety by revolutionizing the commercialization and accessibility of popular art with his enigmatic paintings of waifs with big eyes. The truth would eventually be discovered though: Keane’s art was actually not created by him at all, but by his wife, Margaret (Amy Adams).

National Theatre Live presents Skylight [Sunday 1/25, \$12/\$10 members, 2:00 pm, 3 hours] Skylight is a play by British dramatist David Hare. Bill Nighy and Carey Mulligan feature in the highly anticipated West End production of David Hare’s Skylight, directed by Stephen Daldry, broadcast live from London’s West End by National Theatre Live. On a bitterly cold London evening, schoolteacher Kyra Hollis (Carey Mulligan) receives an unexpected visit from her former lover, Tom Sergeant (Bill Nighy), a successful and charismatic restaurateur whose wife has recently died.
